The regular meeting of the Lake County LEPC (Local Emergency Planning Committee) was called to order by Chair Myron Nagel at the hour of 04:35 pm. in the basement of the Public Safety Bldg.

Minutes:

Motion by Jim Billion to approve the minutes as sent out by email. Second by Jerry Johnson. M/C All were ayes.

Treasurer's Report:

\$11.00 bill for web hosting; purchased 3 computers (\$1299) All are programmed and all picked up but Chester. There is going to be approximately \$2,000. Motion by Karen Lembcke to approve the Treasurer's report as received. Second by Kory Reck. M/C All were ayes.

Agenda/Additions:

Agenda Items Discussed:

1---Don spoke about National Stockpile—medications Tier II Lake County will be a host unit—we will have to be set up within 12 hours to enucleate 40,000 people within 48 hours. (Flu) Biological. The staging area will be the Dakota Prairie Playhouse and the Nat'l Guard Armory & the Community Center. Overflow will go to the Community Center. There will be a burden on law and how to get people there. 9th & Washington probably barricade & shuttle from the Trojan Field parking lot. Minnehah—S Falls is a Tier I, Madison is Tier II and the smaller counties are Tier III. 2 locations (200 +) Security setup concerns. Dept. of Health & County Health Nurses. Rapid City has plan in place. Draft is due in mid October. Final draft—no idea. We will stockpile vaccine. We will have to provide some equipment. Nat'l Guard, school buses, ICAP buses, issues that eill or will not work. One plan for catch all. Identification of children—through the County Health Nurse—not sure. Key people first to include their families. Training that day—we do not know exactly what we will be fighting.

2---Update/revise LEOP—debris management—separate before haul away. Counting loads—real issue. Metal, lumber, & contaminates. Registering of the loads. There is a S Falls person working debris cleanup in Texas & New Orleans.

2003 last time updates. Resource management –identify to deactivating & get equipment back to where it needs to be. NIMS—template, major changes to LEOP

3---Laptops with Cameo, aloha, marplot loaded—Microsoft Office 2000 Get Chester their laptop. Nunda & Ramona have their laptops. The laptops are self sufficient—plug in

4---Jerry Johnson SD SERC Committee State Emergency Response Committee. The Governor's office called and asked him to be on this committee. The SD SERC Committee meets 4 x a year. Bob McGrath is the President. Annual meeting is face to face and there is 3 teleconferences. 3 or 4 other new members. LeAnn Smith retired from DENR. Hazardous materials on farms & concerns about the storage. Is it a reportable quantity? Concerns for 1st responders not knowing what is stored on farms. \$ money from reportable quantity? What are other states doing? Mid September 13th SERC meeting 1 hour in January in Brookings. Plans SERC approved.

5---FY2006---2 events at the same site or 2 different locations. Airport situation. Involve Nat'l Guard—August time frame. POD event 12-24 hours into event has asked to do event with them—stockpile—security, transportation POD Distribution Center. Approximate \$2,000 to spend for the exercise. Funding not an issue. A Committee of volunteers was put together to work on this exercise. They are: Don Thomson, Kory Reck, Donna Budahl, Jim Billion, Chuck Pulford, & Deb Reinicke. (At the typing of these minutes, this committee has had 2 special meetings: 11-2-2005 & 12-7-2005. Emergency Management Director will discuss this at the meeting on Feb 15th, 2006.)

6---Declaration Process- pamphlet could be used for the process of declaration.

8---Danko best setup for sirens—questions on placement. Concerns regarding Lake Herman, Lake Madison & Brant Lake. How determined # of sirens. 4 sirens around lake Herman, 5 sirens around Lake Madison & 3 sirens around Brant Lake. Would be tested 1 x per month—last Friday. Size 18" X 18" w/horn on top, rotates. ?'s on placement. There are laws that govern placement with utilities—least amount of pain to landowners. Can you enlarge map—call vendor—siren project started in 1993, the year of the flood. There was no warning whatsoever—most all will support this project—prime sites & secondary

sites. \$15,000 per siren—total cost—turn key operation. 350-400# per siren. 50/50 matches will be most likely. 75/25 matches—could be guaranteed. Mitigation program. 27 page application (prelim plan & then other plan on the Emergency Management side. 1st week in Nov. Lakes Development Board meets—confirmed committee—fund raiser—ROW type—poles & sirens, Part 1st year & then part whenever. Need someone at meeting to clear all heights from ground 30' to 35' (50' pole)
