

LAKE COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
December 7, 2010

The Board of Lake County Commissioners met in Regular Session on December 7, 2010 at 9 a.m. with the following members present: Dan Bohl, Chris Giles, Roger Hageman, Scott Pedersen, Bert Verhey and Auditor Kay A. Schmidt. Chairman Verhey called the meeting to order.

APPEAL #2010-1:

Gary Zay and Shelli Gust States Atty legal assistant presented the Lake County International-Case IH request for an exemption from Section 903.2.9.1 of the Building Code of Lake County. The following conditions are to be complied with: (a) A "knox box" must be built into the construction either in the wall or in the column next to the East double doors to the showroom. (b) A zoned fire alarm system with an automatic dialer to a 24-hour monitored organization with the main panel installed in the showroom next to the double doors according to the attached proposal from Midwest Alarm dated November 4, 2010. (c) Dry chemical 10 pound minimum ABC fire extinguishers shall be located at each exit and as required in key areas throughout the building as required by the local Fire Chief. (d) All openings in the east/west fire wall between the shop area and all other portion of the building are to be labeled and rated for 1 ½ hours. (e) All new construction shall comply with Chapter 11, Accessibility of the Building Code of Lake County. (f) All boilers and/or furnaces as listed in Table 508.2.5 are to be enclosed in a separate room or building with a 1 hour separation.
