Motion Pedersen, second Hageman convene as a Board of Adjustment at 10:15 am. Motion carried.

#### **CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT:**

**Charles Scholl/Chuck's Recycling and Repair, Inc** Conditional Use permit continued for discussion on property located at N802' W1275' NE ¼ exc S607' of E 817' NE ¼ Sec 25 Concord Twp parcel #4450B. Requesting to start salvage & recycling business in the "AG" District. Regulations require a "Conditional Use" in the "AG" District for this type of business. Present was Charles Scholl, Greg Protsch Atty, Michele Dancer Crt Reporter on behalf of Atty Protsch, Deb Reinicke Zoning-Drainage, Shelli Gust State's Atty Sec and 10 concerned citizens. In the absence of State's Atty Ken Meyer, Chris Giles presented the 8 page document that was reviewed by Commissioner Pedersen, Atty Protsch & Charles Scholl of which was worked from the 16 page document of 1-15-2010. Motion Giles, second Bohl approve the 8 pages with Exhibits A & B be approved as the conditions so we may discuss. Motion carried.

Commissioners Bohl and Hageman met with Ken Meyer State's Atty and compared the old and new documents. Bohl requested to call the question for further discussion on the conditions. Jay Leibel Atty objected to Protsch & Scholl giving continued comments or offer testimony as to the terms and conditions of the requested permit. Protsch objected to any other public input. Giles summarized the following areas. Giles motioned to the provisions being amended and Bohl agreed to his motion. Pg 3. 1) Loading/Intake Area. (2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph) The application shall post a professional looking sign at the gated entrance to the screened area of the real property ***that is readable from the road with letters at a minimum height of six (6) inches and a minimum width of three (3) inches.*** Giles proposed addition and Bohl agrees. Pg 5 1) Initial Inspection continues to Pg 6 (1<sup>st</sup> paragraph). An initial inspection of the real property shall be conducted on August 16, 2010, (2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph) ***The Lake County Zoning official may request that someone from the Lake County Sheriff's Office accompany them if they deem it to be appropriate.*** Pg 6 2) Annual Inspection. An annual inspection of the ***Conditional Use Permit will be required to ensure continued compliance with the conditions made a part of the grant of the Conditional Use Permit.*** Lake County shall conduct an annual inspection of the real property beginning at 10:00 a.m. on ***August 15<sup>th</sup>*** of each year, commencing ***August 15, 2011.*** ***If August 15<sup>th</sup> falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the inspection will take place beginning at 10:00 a.m. the following Monday.*** Giles propose a change to paragraph b, 1<sup>st</sup> sentence and add to paragraph b, Bohl agrees. Pg 5 b) Trees. ***Because the shelterbelt on the East side does not provide as good of a screen as the others, at its option*** the Applicant ***may*** construct a fence on the outside of the shelterbelt along the east side of the real estate of the same materials and in the same manner as the fence described in D. (1) (A) Fences. The fence shall be constructed at least ***twelve (12) feet***

*high and be completed by February 1, 2012; or the Applicant may utilize the existing shelterbelt if he plants a row of evergreen trees on the inside of the existing shelterbelt and the width of the shelterbelt is at least fifty (50) feet. If the Applicant elects to construct the fence, after it is complete he could remove the shelterbelt on the East side of the subject property.* Giles propose a change to paragraph B, add to paragraph b, Bohl agrees. Pg 7 B Surety Bond or Similar Financial Guarantee *If the full amount of the surety bond cannot be obtained by the Applicant by August 15, 2010, the Applicant shall have the option to provide proof of a surety bond in the amount of \$10,000 by August 15, 2010, and obtain and provide proof of a surety bond for the remaining \$10,000.00 by August 15, 2011.* The purpose of the surety bond shall be that in the event that Lake County incurs costs to *remove and dispose of salvageable or hazardous material from the operation of the business in connection with the real property because of the Applicant's operation of a salvage business on the premises, then the bond obligation will be triggered to pay those clean-up costs up to the amount of \$20,000.00.*

Add new paragraph: *If the full amount of the surety bond or suitable alternative referenced above cannot be obtained by the Applicant by August 15, 2010, the Applicant shall have the option to provide proof of a surety bond or suitable alternative in the amount of \$10,000.00 by August 15, 2010, and obtain and provide proof of a surety bond or suitable alternative for remaining \$10,000.00 by August 15, 2011.*

Acknowledge receipt of a letter dated January 19, 2010 from Atty Jay Leibel RE: Charles Scholl Application; regarding objecting to additional comments from Public hearing. Giles request to call question on the amended set of conditions that we have been working on this morning subject to cleanup and full review again at the next meeting. Motion Giles, second Bohl to vote on the amendments on the 8 page document as amended. Chairman Verhey requested a roll call vote, alphabetically. Bohl yes, Giles yes, Hageman yes, Pedersen yes and Verhey yes. (5) Ayes. Motion carried. Motion Pedersen, second Hageman return to Regular Session at 12:22 p.m. Motion carried
