

**LAKE COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
JUNE 15, 2010**

The Board of Lake County Commissioners met in regular session on June 15, 2010 at 9 a.m. with the following members present: Dan Bohl, Chris Giles, Roger Hageman, Scott Pedersen, Bert Verhey and Roberta Janke, Deputy Auditor. Chairman Verhey called the meeting to order.

AGENDA APPROVED:

Motion by Bohl, second by Hageman, to approve the agenda of June 15, 2010 with the following additions: health insurance renewal, POD monies/CHN, radio purchase/sheriff ofc, Nunda Twp road at 220th ST/Brookings and Lake Counties, and telephone utility permit. Motion carried.

MOTOR GRADER PURCHASE ORDER:

Scott Mathison, Hwy Supt., and Ron Bannwarth, Butler Machinery Co., met with the board to discuss Caterpillar Model 140M motor graders as bid to Spink County on November 3, 2009. The base bid amount is \$232,721.00 with additions of 2 ft blade extension \$1,769.00 and 12 ft hydraulic snow wing \$17,350.00 for a total purchase price of \$251,840.00 each. Delivery approximately June 1, 2011. Motion by Giles, second by Bohl, to approve chairman to sign purchase order for 3 motor graders. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION FOR DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY / DISASTER

WHEREAS, Lake County South Dakota has suffered severe damage, brought on by widespread flooding during the periods of March 10, 2010 through June 15, 2010, which has caused damage to road infrastructure and interruption to the normal flow of emergency, school, mail, business, and farm traffic;

WHEREAS, Lake County has committed all available resources and taken all possible actions within the jurisdictional boundaries to combat and to alleviate the emergency/disaster, local resources are not adequate to cope with the situation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Lake County Board of Commissioners at a regular/special meeting held on June 15, 2010, it is hereby requested that the Governor declare an emergency/disaster to exist in the County of Lake, South Dakota.

Thomas Schmidt and Ryan Roetman presented photos to show the damages and discussed the drainage problem. Ken Meyer, States Atty., was asked questions regarding penalties for tiling without a permit. Motion by Hageman to table for two weeks to allow Deb Reinicke and Chuck Lebada to work on this. Motion died for lack of second. Thomas Issenhuth, Atty, asked Schmidt questions about the area. Eugene Larson SR explained what has taken place on his property. Nine others were in attendance. Motion by Giles, second by Hageman, to table drainage complaint until July 6th at 10:45 a.m. Motion carried.
