

**LAKE COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES**  
**March 16, 2010**

The Board of Lake County Commissioners met in Regular Session on March 16, 2010 at 9 a.m. with the following members present: Chris Giles, Roger Hageman, Scott Pedersen, Bert Verhey and Auditor Kay A. Schmidt. Absent: Dan Bohl. Chairman Verhey called the meeting to order.
