Motion Bohl, second Hageman approves the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading of Ordinance #10-50 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE 2009 INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE, AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS. Roll call vote: Bohl aye, Hageman aye, Giles aye, Pedersen aye and Verhey aye. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE #10-50

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE 2009 INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE, AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS.

WHEREAS, Lake County, South Dakota, Board of County Commissioners deems it necessary for the purpose of promoting the health, safety and the general welfare of the County, to adopt the 2009 International Building Code.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY LAKE COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA, that the 2009 International Building code be adopted and provided as follows:

**SECTION A.**

1. The *2009 International Building Code* will provide regulation of construction, alteration, movement, enlargement, replacement, repair, removal and demolition of all buildings, other than detached one and two family dwellings and multiple single-family dwellings (townhomes) not more than three-stories above grade plane in height with separate means of egress and their accessory structures.
2. The *2009 International Building Code* as published by the International Code Council Inc. will be adopted including Chapters 1 through 35 and only Appendices C, E, F, G, H, and J and will be referred to as the Building Code of Lake County, South Dakota and hereinafter called the Building Code.
3. As part of the Lake County Building Code the Lake County Commissioners also adopt the latest version of the *Flood Hazard Map* as prepared and published by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.
4. The effective date of adoption of the Building Code of Lake County will be the 20<sup>th</sup> day after its completed publication. Examinations of plans and inspections of construction are waived until January 2, 2011 after which all plans submitted must be approved prior to the start of construction and all construction of such structures will be inspected for compliance with this code by the Environmental Code Enforcement Officer.
5. If any provision of the Code adopted by this article is in conflict with any other Ordinance, said other Ordinance shall prevail.
6. This Building Code shall cover all of Lake County, South Dakota except those incorporated areas that have passed an ordinance adopting the *2009 International Building Code* for all structures other than detached one and two family dwellings and multiple single-family dwellings (townhomes) not more than three-stories above grade plane in height with separate means of egress and their accessory structures.

## **SECTION B.**

1. The Building Code will be available for inspection at the County Office ordained by the County Commissioners of Lake County in the Lake County Courthouse located at 200 East Center Street, Madison, South Dakota 57042.
2. The existing building fee schedule will be in force until such time as the Lake County Commissioners deem it necessary to change the existing fee schedule to cover the cost of examination of plans, permitting and inspections of construction.

## **SECTION C**

Amendments to the *International Building Code*: Section 103: The Lake County Commissioners shall appoint a building official in charge of examination of plans and inspection of construction and that person shall have the title of Environmental Code Enforcement Officer in the Office of Environmental Code Enforcement.

Section 107.1: Construction Documents and any other information required by the Environmental Code Enforcement Officer shall be prepared by a registered design professional, registered in the State of South Dakota and submitted in triplicate with one copy being retained by the county and two returned to the submitter.

Section 113: The Lake County Commissioners shall become the Board of Appeals for any decisions or determinations made by the Environmental Code Enforcement Officer relative to the application and interpretation of the Building Code. The Commissioners shall adopt rules and procedures for conducting its business, and shall render all decisions and findings in writing to the appellant with a duplicate copy to the Environmental Code Enforcement Officer.

## **SECTION D**

1. That any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The Lake County Commissioners hereby declare that it would have passed this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional.

## **SECTION E**

1. Nothing in this Ordinance or in the Building Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any sit or proceeding impending in any court, or rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in Section A.5 of this Ordinance: nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

## **SECTION F**

1. The Lake County Auditor is hereby ordered and directed to cause this Ordinance to be published.

## **SECTION G**

1. This Ordinance and the rules, regulations, provisions, requirements, orders and matters established and adopted hereby shall take effect and be in full force and effect 20 days from and after the date of its final passage and adoption.
